bolizes our journey of grief. The cross is God's symbol of  
His never ending love for us. The heart is symbolic of our  
never ending love for our precious children.

at the foot of the cross, God's perfect, healing love  
begins to flow, to fill our hearts with peace, and to  
restore us to wholeness.
